1	<i>Glossaries</i>	(i)	Many modern books about the scriptures have useful lists at the back. Important words are put in alphabetical order with a brief explanation of each.	1 (i)
2	<i>Commentaries</i>	(ii)	These are not just collections of maps. Most give interesting information about the historical background of certain events as well as about archaeological discoveries that provide more information about them.	2
3	<i>Bible Atlases</i>	(iii)	The advantage of these is that items of interest can be looked up alphabetically. The word 'Pharisees', for example, will be found under 'P'.	3
4	<i>Biblical Dictionaries</i>	(iv)	This is a book or computer programme that contains all the significant words of the Bible giving information as to where they can be found in the text by book, chapter and verse. They are useful when preparing themes for a celebration.	4
5	<i>Concordances</i>	(v)	These provide background information concerning the historical circumstances to which a passage refers and the culture and customs of the people who were involved in them.	5
